KidStart recruits and trains caring adults to mentor kids who could use extra support. If you can teach a young person how to ride a bike or throw a ball around, or if you enjoy just hanging out, then you have what it takes to be a mentor.

Being a mentor to a young person ages 6-12 is simple and doesn't require special skills, just common sense and a positive attitude. It means spending three hours each week to help them grow, develop confidence, and connect with the community. Many friendships continue into the teen years.

John Howard KidStart Volunteers are:

- * Adults (19 years or older)
- * Selected based on their ability to unconditionally accept a young person
- * Positive role models who develop caring relationships based on mutual trust



Who we help—KIDS!

Referrals are made by a parent or guardian, family member, school counsellor, community worker, social worker, or another significant person in a child's life.

Volunteer mentors are matched with a young person they will see on a weekly basis. They work at developing a supportive relationship by engaging them in community activities. All volunteers are carefully screened (including criminal record and reference checks), trained, and supported by the John Howard KidStart Coordinator.
