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Youth and Family Services

Youth and Family Substance Use Services

Alcohol and drug counselling services for youth, offering assessment, treatment, and individual, group, and family counselling. Self-referrals welcome.

Alcohol & Drug Prevention & Early Intervention

Alcohol and drug services within designated School District 72 schools. Provides information and assists youth in early identification and access to services, including education, counselling, referrals, and groups.

Youth and Family Conflict Resolution

Helps youth and families dealing with conflict through crisis intervention, counselling, mediation, and conflict resolution, as well as parenting education.

180 Degrees

Provides detox and supportive recovery services to youth. Youth reside in John Howard Society family carehomes for up to six months.

Youth to Adult Transition

Helps youth prepare to live independently. Provides advocacy, life skills education, and counselling.

Youth Outreach

Reaches out to youth in the community. Reduces high risk behaviours through supportive counselling and assisting youth to access needed services and healthy activities.

Foundry Youth Mental Health Counselling

Drop-in mental health counselling for young people available Monday-Friday (phone us or check www.foundrybc.ca/campbellriver for schedule).

Foundry Youth Peer Support

Provides individual and group peer support, navigation, and information.

KidStart

Mentoring services for children and youth ages 6-12, delivered by carefully screened and trained volunteers. Many matches continue into the teen years.

Barnett House

Five short-term housing units for youth. Young people in the program typically have financial support from MCFD.

Collaborative Planning

Facilitates a shared decision-making process for families, children, and youth involved with MCFD. Referrals typically come from social workers, but families and youth may request services.

Intensive Support and Supervision

Provides support and supervision to youth referred by a probation officer. The worker assists youth in developing healthy functioning in education, work, family, and community settings.

Youth Forensic Psychiatric Services

Assesses and treats youth involved in the criminal justice system, within the context of their family and community, to decrease their involvement in the system. Coordinates community treatment-release plans for youth in conflict with the law.

Compass

A six-month full time attendance program tailored to meet the individual needs of youth ages 14-18. Youth reside in John Howard Society family carehomes while attending the strengths-based, experiential day program.
