What does the program look like?

The Station is a youth housing facility in Courtenay, owned and managed by The John Howard Society of North Island. The program provides furnished suites for young people ages 16-21, an office for the program staff, large common meeting areas, commercial kitchen, dining area, shared laundry, as well as a caretaker on site. It's close to shopping, recreational centres, bus stops, and major services.



How do you apply to live there?

The first step is usually to speak with a social worker to see if you qualify for financial assistance. You can also call us to ask questions. The Station is a program, so we will explain how that's different from having your own place.







Our Philosophy

We work from a client-centered, strength-based, and relationship-building approach to assist young adults to be self-sufficient and live independently. We want to encourage clients to make healthy lifestyle choices through short and long-term support, advocacy, crisis intervention, life coaching, and referral to other community agencies.

Program Outcomes

In 2023-2024:

- 9 youth participated in the program.
- The longest length of stay amongst youth completing the program was 477 days.
