What is a Family Carehome?

Family carehomes for The John Howard Society of North Island provide safe and supportive homes for youth in two different programs: Compass and 180° (Detox and Supportive Recovery). Family carehomes are integral to the success of our community-based organization.

Caregivers:

- have part-time or full-time options
- receive non-taxable retainers and per diem payments
- have access to 24-hour on-call support and monthly respite
- take part in ongoing training
- build positive relationships
- foster a nurturing family environment

Who are the Youth Needing Care?

The young people we take into our programs:

- are ages 12 to 19
- come from a variety of backgrounds
- have individual needs

They all have one thing in common: each youth needs to have a stable, caring family setting.

Training and Support

Caregivers are introduced to the John Howard team and orientated to the youth programs, standards, and guidelines. Following this initial training, caregivers attend monthly meetings to:
